

Woking 50+ Club Walk - Chinthurst & Shalford
Wednesday, 19th August 2020

Covid-19 Coronavirus: This walk is with restricted numbers. You will need to pre-book your place on the walk with Hilary Thomas.

Meeting Point: The Chinthurst Hill Car Park on B2128. No Postcode.
OS Explorer 145: TQ 014462 GPS: 51.2068 -0.5495

Time: 10.00 am start

Distance: 4.9 miles

Leader: Alan Sandell (01483 222903 or 0796 737 4559 on the day)

Directions: Proceed into Guildford and take the A281 towards Horsham. At the roundabout in Shalford turn left onto the A248. At the junction where the A248 turns left continue straight on (B2128). Almost immediately, just by the Waverley sign, turn right into the road that ends with Chinthurst Hill Car Park. There is a 2m height restriction on the car park.

Alternatively take the A247 from Woking through Send and West Clandon to the A25. Continue on the A25 past Newlands Corner to Silent Pool and turn right onto the A248 signposted Godalming and Albury. Go through Albury and Chilworth. At the T-junction turn left onto the B2128. Almost immediately, just by the Waverley sign, turn right into the road that ends with Chinthurst Hill Car Park. There is a 2m height restriction on the car park.

The Walk: The walk does **not** go up Chinthurst Hill. It is an undulating walk through varied countryside in the Surrey Hills, across farmland with some good views, through wooded areas, along an old railway track and close to an old canal. The coffee stop will be almost half way round in Shalford. There are no stiles and no hills, only gentle undulations. There is some walking along minor roads and tracks, we will cross four busy main roads, and there are two railway crossings on the flat.

As with all walks please wear suitable footwear especially if it has been wet. The majority of the walk is on firm ground and I don't expect it to be wet and muddy.

Lunch: None organised.

Dogs: Sorry, but because of possible trip and fall hazard that dogs present to our walkers, we regret dogs are not welcome on 50+ walks.

First Aiders: The walk leader will carry a **basic** first aid kit and a mobile phone in case of minor accidents, though mobile coverage is limited in this area. It is expected that all walkers will be prepared for the conditions. However, if any walker is a qualified first aider, would they make themselves known to the walk leader before the start.
