

Woking 50+ Club Walk - Chobham Common
Wednesday, 16th October 2024

Meeting Point: Outside the Four Horseshoes pub on the B383 on the northern edge of Chobham. GU24 8QP. OS ref: SU 970629

Time: 10.00 am start

Distance: approximately 4.3 miles

Leaders: Alan Sandell (01483 222903 or 0796 737 4559 on the day)

Directions: From Chobham take the B389 towards Sunningdale. The Four Horseshoes is set back from the main road on the left shortly after the 40mph signs and the turning to Windlesham. It would actually be better to take the turn towards Windlesham and then turn right almost immediately.

Park in the Car Park if you intend to lunch in the Four Horseshoes, otherwise park on one of the roads that criss-cross the green area outside the pub.

The Walk: This is an undulating walk through varied woodland, across farmland and heathland. There is one short hill and three stiles - sorry. The coffee and group photo stop will be about half way round at a single bench that will probably hold four or maybe five people. Unfortunately I couldn't find a better place. I think it is a nice scenic walk, but there are no real features to photograph.

As with all walks please wear suitable footwear especially if it has been wet. The majority of the walk is on firm or sandy ground. There were a few wet patches that were hard to avoid when I walked it on 28th September. We will need to be aware of horse riders, cyclists and dog walkers.

Lunch: The Four Horseshoes pub (<https://www.fourhorseshoeschobham.co.uk/>) does sandwiches and snacks as well as meals. Despite the fact that the menu on the website doesn't mention sandwiches I was assured that the pub does do them at lunchtime. I have not booked.

<p><u>First Aiders:</u> The walk leader will carry a basic first aid kit and a mobile phone in case of minor accidents. It is expected that all walkers will be prepared for the conditions. However, if any walker is a qualified first aider, would they make themselves known to the walk leader before the start.</p>
